"Dementia is more than just memory loss. Different types, such as dementia with Lewy bodies or frontal variant Alzheimer's disease, can show up with changes in behavior rather than forgetfulness. Frontotemporal dementia (FTD) affects behavior, especially

in those under 65, causing inappropriate actions and reduced self-awareness. Vascular dementia, often linked to strokes, impacts mental abilities beyond memory. Diagnosis includes brain scans and thorough cognitive testing. Recognizing these various symptoms is vital for spotting dementia early and providing timely help."
